Program Objectives

FFP will provide 15-20 pounds of food, weekly, to each eligible low-income senior and/or disabled adult who seeks food assistance and for those who are homebound, FFP will coordinate home deliveries for them.

FSC will conduct a nutritional needs evaluation for an average of 15 clients per month and will share the relevant findings with FFP—including those who qualify for home delivery services.

Program Outcomes/Measurables

1. HOME DELIVERIES: FFP delivered to 86 households/122 individuals this quarter—providing each person in the household with approximately 15 pounds of food, for a total of 21,960 pounds delivered.
2. DAILY DISTRIBUTION: FFP distributed to 198 households/398 individuals this quarter—providing each person in the household with approximately 15 pounds of food, for a total of 71,640 pounds were distributed.
3. FSC provided FFP with 6 additional clients who qualified for home deliveries this quarter. These 6 are included above for home delivery stats.
