Program Goal & Objectives

The goal of the Door through Door program is to provide timely and appropriate interventions for referred clients to improve their safety and access to quality care, and to reduce the likelihood of hospital readmission.

The objectives are the following:

- 1) Connect with at least 115 older adults who are or have been recently hospitalized to provide resources and support to improve their safety and well-being.
- 2)Actively provide interventions, referrals, and/or education services for at least 70% of referred clients. (Note that some referred clients refuse help or do not survive the hospital stay.)
- 3) Through our interventions, 90% of clients we actively engage with will not be readmitted within 30 days due to preventable conditions.
- 4) Successfully prevent wrongful or unsafe discharge from a healthcare facility in at least 40% of such identified cases.

Program Outcomes & Measurables

Our Door-to-Door program made significant strides in achieving our objectives and creating a profound impact in our community:

Objective 1: Connecting with Hospitalized Older Adults

Outcome: Our advocates engaged with 19 recently hospitalized clients this quarter, providing crucial support during their recovery.

Progress: Achieved 80% of our annual goal of connecting with 115 hospitalized older adults, ensuring they receive the care and attention they need.

Objective 2: Providing Interventions and Referrals

Outcome: We provided interventions, referrals, and education services to 91% of referred clients, directly enhancing their well-being.

Progress: Met our target by actively supporting referred clients, contributing to their safety, stability, and overall health.

Objective 3: Preventing Hospital Readmissions

Outcome: An impressive 95% of engaged clients did not experience hospital readmission within 30 days due to our effective interventions.

Progress: Surpassed our annual goal, demonstrating our program's success in reducing healthcare burdens and promoting sustainable recovery.

Objective 4: Preventing Wrongful Discharges

Outcome: We successfully prevented wrongful discharge from healthcare facilities for 90% of identified cases, protecting our clients' rights and well-being.

Progress: Exceeded our annual goal of 40%, ensuring safe and appropriate transitions for vulnerable individuals.

These measurable outcomes underscore the transformative power of our Door-to-Door program in addressing critical needs and improving the lives of our clients. By delivering timely interventions and referrals, we are significantly reducing hospital readmissions and ensuring safe transitions for older adults in our community.
