The program addresses specific physical and mental needs of cognitively or physically impaired seniors and adults through socialization, physical and mental enrichment activities, and movement exercises. To support and provide respite to our client's informal caregivers.

Program Outcomes & Measurables

The Adult Day Care program served 25 clients during this reporting period, providing 522 days of service. This is an increase of 7 clients and 131 days of service from the previous quarter. Among these 25 clients, two low-income seniors received a scholarship made possible by FRHD grant funding. Their attendance accounted for 21 of the 522 total days of service this quarter. Participating in our program, 25 families were able to take a break while their loved ones received care. During this cycle, three support sessions were provided through the Caregiver Support Group.

Prue has some cognitive and physical challenges following a stroke several years ago. Leland, Prue's husband, brings her to the Adult Day Center five times a week because he still works full-time and cannot care for her during the day.

Once the life of the party, Prue became withdrawn and depressed after her stroke. After coming to the center on a regular basis, Prue learned that it was a safe haven filled with kind and attentive caregivers and activities that stimulated her mind and moved her body.

Things also changed for Leland. His initial anxiety about leaving Prue at the center shifted to relief as he quickly saw how Prue was "blossoming," he realized that while he was working, she was getting the exact interaction, companionship, and caregiving she needed.




