#### **Program Goal & Objectives**

The Door through Door program aims to provide timely and appropriate interventions for referred clients to improve their safety and access to quality care and to reduce the likelihood of hospital readmission. The objectives are the following: 1) Connect with at least 115 older adults who are or have been recently hospitalized to provide resources and support to improve their safety and well-being. 2)Actively provide interventions, referrals, and/or education services for at least 70% of referred clients. (Note that some referred clients refuse help or do not survive the hospital stay.) 3) Through our interventions, 90% of clients we actively engage with will not be readmitted within 30 days due to preventable conditions. 4) Successfully prevent wrongful or unsafe discharge from a healthcare facility in at least 40% of such identified cases.

#### **Program Outcomes & Measurables**

In this quarter, our advocates helped 22 clients through the door-to-door program and provided interventions, referrals, and education services to 96% of these clients. Our intervention prevented hospital readmissions within 30 days for 98% of the clients we engaged with by implementing effective measures. Furthermore, we prevented wrongful discharge from healthcare facilities for 100% of the 7 identified cases.


#### **Impact Story**

Graham is a disabled veteran who was homeless and low-income. He was referred to us for assistance with various challenges. Recently, he suffered a leg fracture from a fall and was hospitalized. While he was recovering, our Advocates enrolled him in our transportation program to ensure he made it to all necessary medical appointments. To address his nutritional needs after he was discharged from the hospital, Alex connected him with the Fallbrook Food Pantry for food box deliveries. She also helped him enroll in one of the SDGE senior assistance programs, which eased his worries about the future.

All these services, from pre-surgery to post-recovery, are made possible by the generous funding we receive from the Fallbrook Regional Health District. Their support enables us to provide comprehensive assistance for older adults' physical and mental needs and turn overwhelming situations like Graham's into stories of resilience and community care.


